
Our Aims

The 4 key principles which underpin our EYFS practise are:

<u>A Unique Child</u>- Every child is a unique child who is constantly learning and can be resilient.

<u>Positive Relationships</u>- Children learn to be strong and independent through positive relationships.

<u>Enabling Environments</u>- Children learn and develop well in enabling environments, in which their experiences respond to their individual needs and there is a strong partnership between practitioners and parents and carers.

Learning and Development:

Children develop and learn in different ways. The framework covers the education and care of all children in Early Years provision, including children with special educational needs and disabilities.

It is very important that we are made aware of any medical conditions or illnesses which may affect your child.

If your child has asthma, please ensure that a <u>named</u> inhaler is brought into school and given directly to your child's class teacher and that a relevant medical form is completed at the office.

If your child requires medicine whilst at school, please ensure a medical administration form is filled out at the office beforehand.

If your child is not well enough to attend school, please ring the school office at the earliest opportunity.

Also, if your child becomes ill during the school day, we may contact you and ask for them to be collected from school.

Our School Day

Breakfast club starts at 8am. There is toast, cereal and juice provided. The cost is £1 per day or £4 per week.

School is open from 8:40am for children to arrive. Children will come into school through the designated Nursery doors.

Nursery sessions are 8:40am-11:40am for the morning and 12:20pm-3:20pm for the afternoon.

For full time children, the Nursery lunchtime is 11:45-12:15 and children will eat in the school hall.

If you wish for your child to have a school meal, please contact the school office. You may also wish for your child to bring a packed lunch. There must be 1 weeks' notice given if changing from packed lunches to school dinners.



Our Nursery curriculum is based around topics that aim to engage children within all aspects of their learning and provide them with meaningful experiences.

We cover a new topic each half term and ensure that each topic incorporates all areas of the EYFS framework. Each half term an overview of each topic is sent home to parents along with a homework grid so that you are aware of your child's current learning in school and can support this at home.

The EYFS framework is then divided into seven areas.

The three prime areas are:

- Communication and Language
 - Physical Development
- Personal, Social and Emotional Development

The four specific areas are:

- Literacy
- Maths
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design

We also incorporate the characteristics of effective learning throughout our curriculum. These are;

- Playing and Exploring
 - Active Learning
- Creating and Critical Thinking
