Message from Mrs Crompton

Thank you for all your support at our Christmas Fair this week, a grand total of nearly £800 was raised which is amazing - the children are going to enjoy Jack and the Beanstalk pantomime on 10th December fully funded by our Christmas fair.

We have made some changes to our **Christmas Disco** on **Tuesday 17th December** following parent feedback that families wanted to go and get children changed into disco clothes - we agree!! Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children will go home at 3.15pm as normal and get changed and glammed up returning to school for their Christmas disco at 4pm - 5.15pm. The disco is £4 and includes a hot dog and drink (vegetarian options will be available). School Council will be hosting the disco as part of their responsibilities. Please come along and support them.

Nursery Disco will be separate as it is too overwhelming for most little ones with the rest of the school in the dark - their disco will be part of the afternoon session at 2.15pm - 3pm and Morning Nursery children are invited back too. Ideas about how the world was created and how we should care for it can be shaped by someone's religion or belief. We should never be treated unfairly because of our religion or belief.



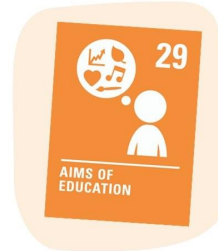
