There is an expectation that children are in school everyday! Here is this week's attendance and lates.



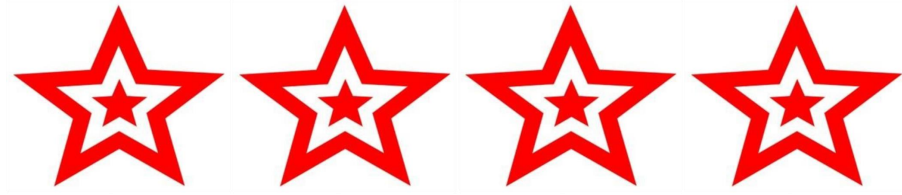

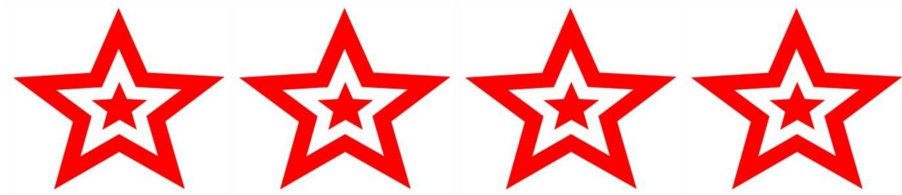

Big Schools' Birdwatch, organised by the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds (RSPB), is taking place in schools this month. Children are being asked to count birds they see in their school grounds so that the RSPB, who help to protect and care for birds, know which birds are being seen often and which are not.

Think about: Where do you see birds at school? Do you know what types of bird you see? Do you ever see birds anywhere else?

Maybe in a garden, a park, a wooded area, near a river or a lake? Why do you think it's important for the RSPB to know which birds are being seen and which are not? Do you like to see birds? Are there any birds that you don't like? Why?

There are rules and laws in place to protect birds. We can all help by putting out food for them in the winter and looking after the places where birds like to live.

The beautiful diversity in birds and wildlife mirrors the diversity within our own communities. By celebrating our differences, we can treat everyone with fairness and respect.



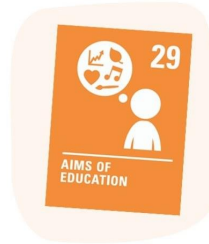
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UN Rights of the Child
